READ-A-THON WEEK 2 (No homework.....get those reading minutes in. *Second Place is the first loser.*)

WOW PROJECT WEEK! Candlelight Ski/Snowshoe Tour on Wednesday night (6:30-8:00pm)

Money raised from the event will be donated to Silver Creek and the Nature Conservancy. The students are putting this on fully and organizing the night. The trail is in and it looks great. Ice luminaries are about ready. The plan is for you to come with your child and spend part of the time volunteering at a station....and then take time to hike the trail.

EQUIPMENT NEEDED (please have your name on it somehow.....or know where we placed it)

- backyard portable fire pans/pits (we need 3)
- firewood for each of the 3 pits
- a few bags of oranges for Wednesday morning candle making
- 3-4 gas lighters (long nosed) to help light the luminaries at 6:00 pm
- EACH STUDENT will need to bring a shovel ON WEDNESDAY to shovel snow onto the sidewalk part of the trail.
- Anyone have a "greeting" tent or table to be placed at the head of the school driveway for the INFO BOOTH?
- If you have various gas lanterns, candle lanterns, tikki torches etc....bring them. We can light up our activity areas. Carrying lanterns is encouraged (with adult supervision....we don't need to start the winter version of the CASTLE ROCK FIRE)

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-marshmallows / sticks /snacks to share

If you can volunteer for any of the jobs below, please email me. The idea is that one student is at a station at all times. They can take turns going through the course with their parents.

OUR STATIONS / JOBS / Volunteers needed

STATION 1: Information Booth that will be run by Lilia Page and Gretel Huss. Located at the head of the CS Driveway. Parking will be across from Ice Rink....the trail starts immediately at the CS DRIVEWAY. Lilia and Gretel are giving directions, handing out score cards, collecting donations, and explaining the rules of the trail. They could use a greeting tent, table, and maybe a BUDDY HEATER to stay warm.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED: 1 Adult to stop traffic from coming up the driveway and directing to Sun Valley Parking Lot. 1 or 2 Adults to help the girls with their jobs.....enforcing the NO PETS rule.

TRAIL VOLUNTEER NEEDED TO HIDE OUT IN THE WOODS AND MAKE SURE PEOPLE DO NOT CUT TRAILS AND GO OFF INTO RIVER.

STATION 2: Slip and Slide Activity that will be run by Tyler Salvoni and Quincy Davis. Participants run and see how far they can slide on the parking lot ice patch. Remember: SAFETY THIRD.

VOLUNTEER: One gutsy adult to make sure everyone stays safe and help the boys enforce the safety rules.

STATION 3: Trailside Bonfire and Hot Cocoa Stand run by Colin Pogue and Lachlan Clarke. The boys will serve up Hot Cocoa and try not to set the Middle School Learning Pods on fire. Frank Salvoni has volunteered to manage the fire safety part.

VOLUNTEER: I need an adult to help with the organization of the Hot Cocoa part.

STATION 4: Human Bowling Activity run by Koa Mott, Alex

Khosrowshahi, and Calvin Miller. The boys will be guiding participants in the ancient sport of human bowling. Hoping for some tikki torches at this one. Riley Mott has volunteered to manage the human projectiles and keep the participants moving down the trail.

STATION 5: Snowball Toss "Feed the Hungry Yeti" Activity run by Parker Turck and Liesl Beyer. The girls will be running the snowball fight of the evening.

VOLUNTEER: We need an adult to help manage the snowballs so none of them fly through the arts building windows. Possible fire and hot cocoa if we find enough fire pits.

STATION 6: Snowshoe/Ski Olympic Sprint Activity run by Zander Douglas and John Tumolo. The boys will be organizing a 30 yard time trial across a snowfield.

VOLUNTEER: The boys need one adult to help manage a waiting line and timing. Tikki Torches.....FLAMING FINISH LINE? Bob Polk...WE NEED YOU HERE!

STATION 7: Olympic Curling run by Anika Vandenburg and Bridgette Silva. The girls are running the curling event.

VOLUNTEER: The girls need one adult to help with line management. Fire? Tikki Torches? Flaming Curling stones?

STATION 8: Hockey Slapshot Activity run by Russell Stumph and Matt Letourneau. The boys have a slap shot competition set up in the elementary playground next to the playground BONFIRE.

VOLUNTEER: The boys need an adult to help keep everyone's teeth intact. Fire management skills a must.

STATION 9: The Great Chili Cook-Off Run by Charlie Price and Will Ring. The boys will be making Chili all day Wednesday and then take turns serving the masses after the participants finish the trail.

VOLUNTEER: They will need some help. Melanie or I will be around. They will go shop for ingredients and cook like mad. We need Croc Pots to keep it all warm. We need help with compostable bowls / cutlery. Drinks? Bluegrass Music?

STATION 10: SCORING THE YETI run by Chloe McGowan and Anabel Viesturs. The girls are making 3 life-size Yetis to hide on the course. They will then run the scoring table in the Community Room with the Chili Fest.
